Business Plan 2021-2022

Introduction

The team usually works to a three year business planning cycle which was due for renewal in 2020 to coincide with the anticipated revision of the national Sexual Health and Blood Borne Virus Framework.

The Team's annual report for 2020-2021 illustrates the adaptations team put in place to the context of COVID 19. As recovery continues and the national decision to develop the next multi-year SHBBV Framework is now scheduled for late 2022, the team has developed this one year plan setting out new or substantially adapted areas of work.

This business plan builds on the pre-existing work programmes many of which will also roll over into this year, however this report focusses solely on the new work areas.

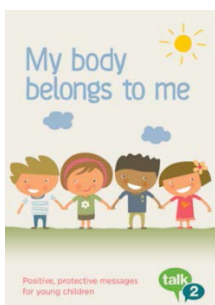
Children and Young People Section

Early Protective Messages

THE EPM programme is well established in early years establishments across the Board area. This year the Team will develop an EPM online portal to support consistent practice for staff and for parents and carers. This will augment the ongoing training provision to early years staff, health visitors, and family nurses.

The online portal will launch in July 2021.

Relationships, Sexual Health and Parenthood Education

The team continues to lead the national partnership which contract manages and advises on age an stage appropriate RSHP learning activities for all of Scotland's schools, hosted at www.rshp.scot The major development for this year is developing new content specifically designed to support learning children and young people with Complex Learning Needs and their parents and carers. This is a parallel contract and after piloting the final resources will be available of the new academic year in August 2021.

Continuous Professional Development for staff

The training team will complete reworking the content all CPD courses for staff working with young people to both full online delivery methods and in due course, blended delivery methods. This will include the courses provided to foster carers, residential care staff, youth workers, teaching staff and other staff groups working with young people.

After the summer the training team will undertake adaptation, piloting and delivery of revised training courses for staff working with vulnerable adults.

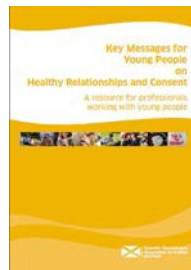

Demonstrating Consent Film Production

The team leads a national partnership developing a series of interactive film clips for young people demonstrating to young people practical support for how to put into place mutually agreed consent to sexual activity. These will be widely disseminated through purchased social media advertising. The partnership involves health boards and third sector partners and has direct involvement of young people in shaping the products. The finished films will be completed by November 2021.

Adult Section

Free Condoms Service

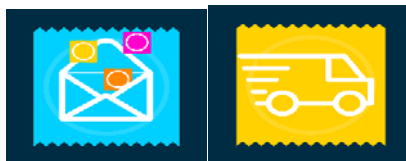
The service will continue to provide an interim blended access model of venue provision across the health board with a postal delivery service while longer term models are developed. A Free Condoms service recovery plan including mapping exercise will be developed to ensure venues have sufficient support reopening and service users are able to access supplies as easily as possible. In addition the completion of the website refresh and online sign up and refresh session for venues will aid the new way of working mainly online.

MSM Masterclass

This will include the national work led by the team to develop a revised staff training programme on sexual health for Gay and Bisexual Men for delivery to wide range of service providers. This will link into dissemination of the SMMASH3 research report.

Social Marketing

Staff continue to lead a social marketing campaign commissioned to Terence Higgins Trust for delivery. The aim of the project is increasing HIV testing frequency among GBMSM and to encourage men to adopt proactive testing patterns relative to their risk. The campaign will be delivered over three waves launching towards in August 2021 with further waves in November 2021 and February 2022.

Programme of staff and peer training

Working in collaboration with other HI teams a programme of staff and peer training will be developed, to support those whom work in the Homelessness Services, Alcohol & Drug Recovery Services, Community Justice Services and Prison Setting. A pilot will be trailed in Glasgow City HSCP.

Needs Assessment for those supporting Adults with Learning Disabilities

The team will undertake engagement with staff that work directly with adults with learning disabilities to assess their levels of knowledge, and confidence in discussing and responding to sexuality, sexual health, and relationships with their clients. This will inform the

development of plans in collaboration with appropriate services to support staff. This is likely to include coordinating or developing information resources, along with developing a programme of staff training.
